

Word from the Board

The Board is pleased to announce that as of January, Pastor John Murinko passed down the reins of his plumbing business, Bill the Fauceteer, to his son, Eric. The transition has been quite extensive as they also moved locations, but with that being said, this will afford Pastor John the opportunity to serve full time at The City Gate.

In case you didn't know John's involvement in our organization, a little background is in order. In 1996, Pastor John had been volunteering for five years at this homeless outreach ministry. His role in helping others through his volunteering had grown to be the most important part of his life, so, when the head of the ministry was let go, Murinko applied for the job. He got it easily because not many were all that interested given the tiny amount of compensation and massive responsibilities.

So, for the past twenty years, John has spent about forty hours a week caring for people and then spent another 20 or so hours doing plumbing work. He currently receives no salary from The City Gate except in the form of a small housing allowance.

As the head of The City Gate, John's role includes the oversight of many facets, including: 1)the food and clothing bank; 2) feeding the downtown's homeless eight to ten meals per week; 3) managing the organization's staff of a dozen plus hundreds of volunteers; 4) dealing with many of the issues that come with keeping 28 low-income units occupied; and, 5) preaching weekly at the church service.

More important than any of these managerial and administrative responsibilities is meeting people—this is Pastor John's top priority. People. Talking to someone. Comforting them. Listening, hearing their story.

The only thing that counts for John is seeing lives changed. It is not hard to see the lives that take a turn for the better through John's love for them, which is an expression of John's love for Jesus. When someone is at the bottom, improvement for the better isn't too hard to see but it always takes a while. Decreasing dependence on their drug of choice is the most obvious measure, but if it comes, progress is almost always slow. It takes time to walk out of enslavement, a labor-intensive process of building a relationship, and change comes only with a significant up-front investment of individual time.

Because Pastor John, The City Gate and of course because of GOD, over the years, hundreds of people have transitioned from living on the street back into a more whole and healthy life. When asked about numbers, though, Murinko will plead ignorance because he doesn't know. To him, the question *how many?* Is irrelevant because his focus is only on the next willing person. It is on to the next one in need, and in Spokane, the supply in never ending.

With this recent transition, John will now be able to focus more fully on the needs of the ministry and its clients. The Board is excited about the possibilities of what will come next. We have absorbed the large space in the south end of our building that was formerly rented, and the area is now being remodeled with a grand opening planned soon; the development of new programs is also just getting underway.

As we enter this exciting new phase, the Board asks that you continue to hold The City Gate up in prayer with an emphasis on choosing between our alternatives wisely. And, directly related to making the best choices, please pray that God would make available the additional financial support that will be needed to implement any expansion of our services.
