I acknowledge with my German and English heritage that I can often be stubborn, although I prefer the word "determined". Recently my 14-year old car was broken into while I was parked at my office for the day. My unwelcomed guest used a crowbar to wrench the door, and then finally just broke out the window to gain access. My guest made off with about \$3.00 in quarters, but then also took five cassette tapes (yes, I have a <u>cassette</u> player in my car!). These cassettes were sermons that were clearly labeled.

Skip now to two days later. I received an insurance estimate of \$1,124.00 to repair the damages to my car. I then told the insurance adjuster to skip repainting the door to lower the cost. I was <u>real-</u> <u>ly</u> grumbling in my head about how unfair it was for me to have all this expense for \$3.00 in quarters: "God is just being mean." It was all about me. Then it happened.

In my mind I hear this voice: "So, Rich, you profess to be a Christian counselor who is concerned about the souls of those you see. Yet when someone breaks into your car and takes cassette tapes that will bring My Word to them and draw them closer to Me, you are upset because you are personally paying the price for this to happen. Is that right?"

I felt two inches tall. In that moment I became convicted in my spirit that my eyes were on material things and not on Him. I was more concerned about things that rust and dent than on that which has eternal value. I resolved on that day to never again lock my car. On my back seat I have placed a stack of new Bibles for new believers. As those disappear I will replace them with more. If you or anyone you know would like one, please just help yourself.

But wait, this little lesson for me was not over. One week later I received a check in the mail for \$615.00. I learned that the insurance company owes the <u>entire</u> amount of the claim even if I elect not to have all the repairs done. Yes, this means the
