VOLUNTEER COUPLE'S STORY (Part 1)

Terry and Pamela Johnson met the day after Pamela got out of serving a prison sentence for something she states, "I DIDN'T DO!" Pamela will tell you that what she didn't do is pick the phone up and dial 911 after her boyfriend committed murder. A decision that cost a small town girl, raised with high moral standards, seven and a half years of her life behind bars.

Growing up in a small agricultural community in California, Pamela was brought up learning about good morals and how to read her Bible. She reminisces about being her mothers' little shadow, volunteering at their local food bank and VFW, and describes her step-father as "Mr. Rogers". Pamela fondly remembers her step-dad, a patient and kind man, taking the family for Sunday drives to listen and talk with them. Behind the picture perfect family, Pamela was scarred with memories of repeated molestation by multiple people. The abuse included violent offenses, possibly resulting in her inability to conceive children, leaving her with a twisted self-image that she was only worth what she could "put out!"

During her senior year, Pamela's mother divorced her stepdad, and moved into town with Pamela, and Pamela's niece who lived with them. She recalls feeling like she was "in the way". Pamela's mom eventually sent her away to live in Las Vegas with her birth father whom she didn't know. Her mother had only referred to him as "Good-For-Nothing" and told Pamela he had molested her when she was little. Hurt and confused, Pamela did not understand why her mom would send her away to live with him after all these years.

Pamela's life in chaos, she ended up getting back together with her high school sweetheart.

He was her first boyfriend who stuck to her like glue. Their codependent relationship seemed to be going fine until the day he spun out of control, taking the life of someone who threatened to tear them apart. In shock and more confused than ever, Pamela didn't have the wherewithal to call the police.

Pamela was sentenced to serve five to twelve years in the state of Nevada where her outgoing, bubbly personality became withdrawn and overwhelmed by crowds. Being a bright and creative person with a high school diploma, Pamela tutored inmates in jail and had much time to selfreflect. Dealing with abandonment

issues, Pamela recalls her mom always saying, "You make your bed, you


Our maintenance person has been hard at work **replacing cabinetry**, **flooring**, **and sinks** as well as the usual painting to keep things fresh and clean.
