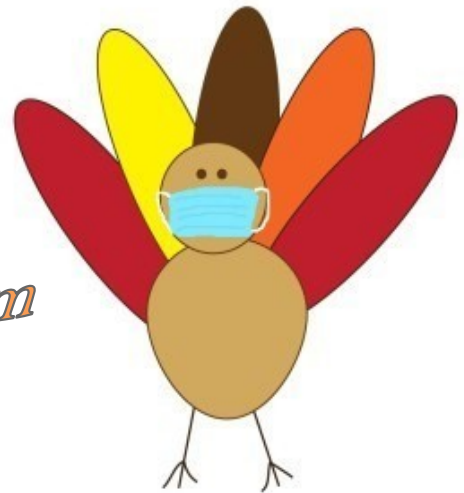

I was excited because I too wore a 12 and had on a brand new pair of Brooks running shoes.

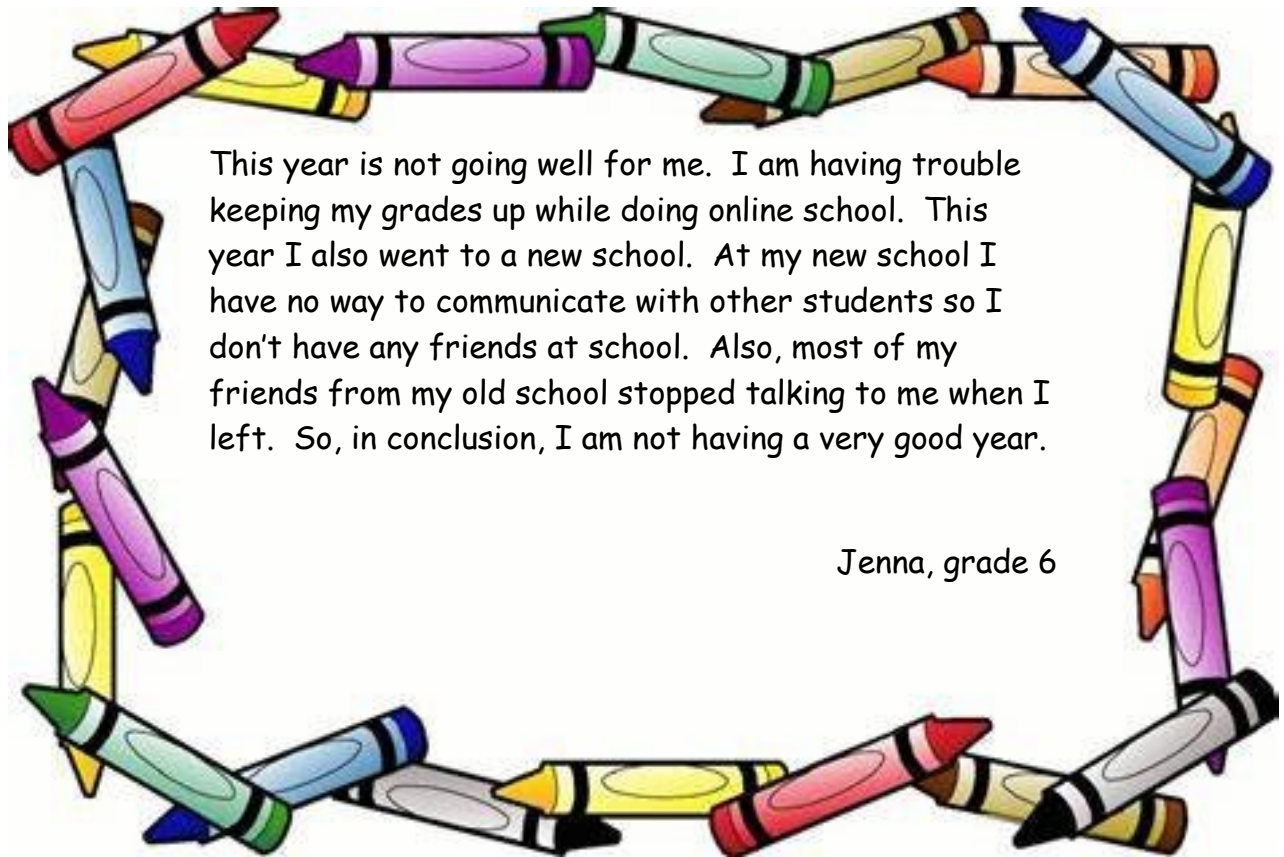

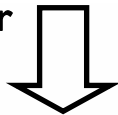
